## Regulator Announces Interim Price Cap on C&W Guernsey

The OUR has announced a decision to extend the existing control on the prices that C&W Guernsey charges its customers for services it provides over its fixed telecommunications network. The price cap will cover the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2005 to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2005.

"C&W Guernsey's existing price control will be extended for a period of six months to allow the OUR to complete work on a more longer term price control which will come into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2005" said John Curran, Director General with the OUR. "The price control will ensure that further downward pressure is maintained on core services and that any increases that C&WG may propose are controlled."

The price control applies to four main baskets of services and includes such services as local, Jersey and national calls, leased lines, line rental and the shortcall services.

"While the OUR would hope that in future the number of services being controlled will decrease as competition becomes effective, for now there remains a need for such controls" said John Curran. "A decision on the scope of the new price control and the services that may be covered will be finalised over the next number of months".
