# Large fall in cost of business connectivity in Guernsey

The cost of on-Island leased telecommunication services that support business communication within Guernsey and to the rest of the world are to fall by as much as 44% and 52%.

Sure (Guernsey) has announced it will be voluntarily reducing the price of higher capacity lines, following a wholesale price control consultation initiated by the Guernsey Competition & Regulatory Authority (the GCRA).

Michael Byrne, Chief Executive of the GCRA said, "These price reductions will have a direct cut-through to the cost of doing business in Guernsey and is an excellent outcome for the sector. I want to commend Sure for the approach it has taken, and I am sure its customers will appreciate the significant reductions it has committed to and how swiftly it intends to implement them."

The price changes will come into effect on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2022.

The GCRA will continue with its wider review and is engaging with key stakeholders to identify any additional areas of priority going forward.
