## Electricity Prices to increase from April

The OUR has agreed to Guernsey Electricity's request to increase tariffs which will rise by an average of 6.5% from 1<sup>st</sup> April. A new price control on Guernsey Electricity will come into effect from that date for a 12 month period.

'Guernsey Electricity had requested a tariff rise due to higher oil and import costs, while higher demand for electricity during the winter saw plans for investment in infrastructure being brought forward by Guernsey Electricity to meet that demand. The company is also being allowed to recover certain generation costs incurred in 2009-10. In the circumstances we have sought to ensure GEL works harder to find efficiencies and we are requiring the company to reduce costs by approximately £0.4m. As a result of these factors, we have allowed for a 6.5% rise in tariffs from 1<sup>st</sup> April,' said John Curran, Director General at the OUR.

The OUR is also changing its approach to how Guernsey Electricity tariffs are set. The company will in future have greater freedom to determine individual tariff changes subject to complying with an overall 'revenue cap'.
